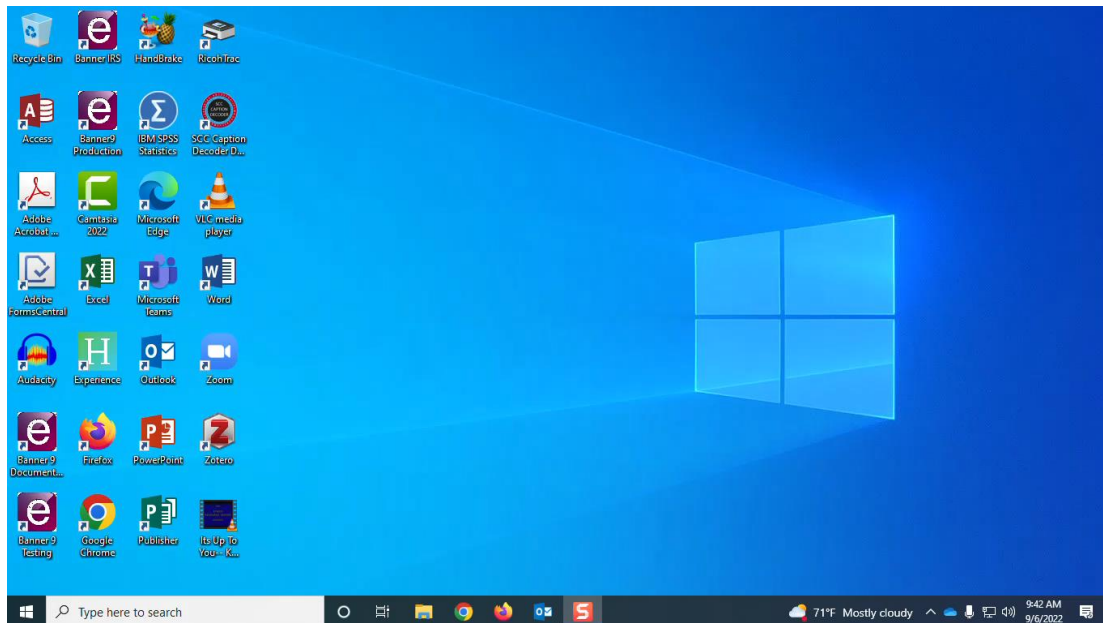


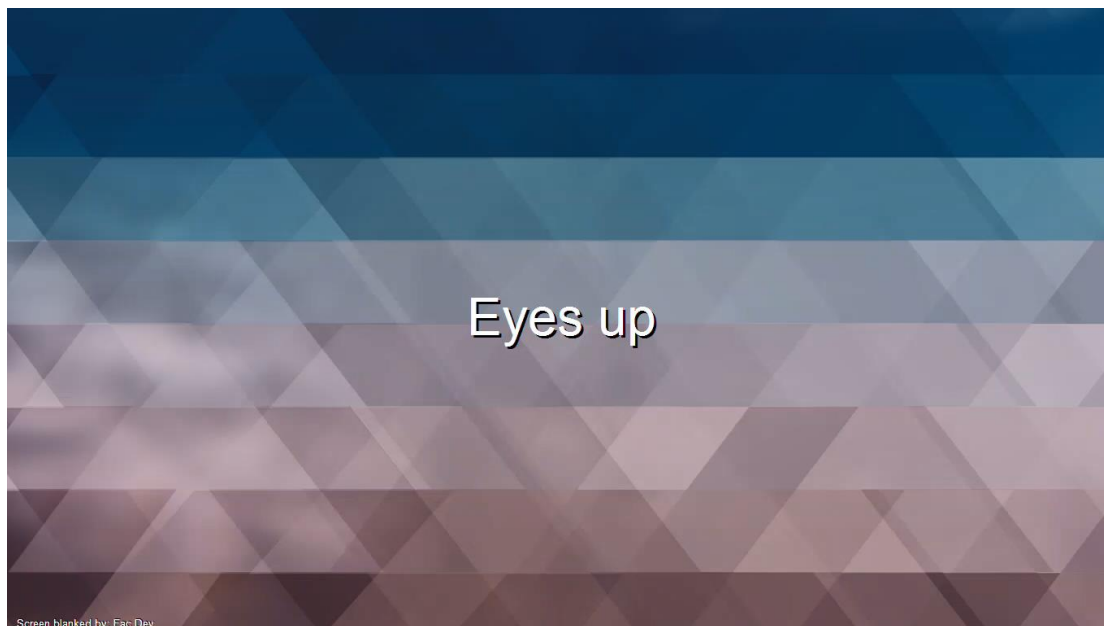
LanSchool Air for Students

LanSchool Air has been deployed in various computer labs to enable instructors to monitor student computer screens and to direct activities via remote control from a teacher's workstation. This handout identifies some of the LanSchool Air tools that students may use from their lab computer.

When a LanSchool Air class session begins, the computer screen will initially look no different than it does typically.



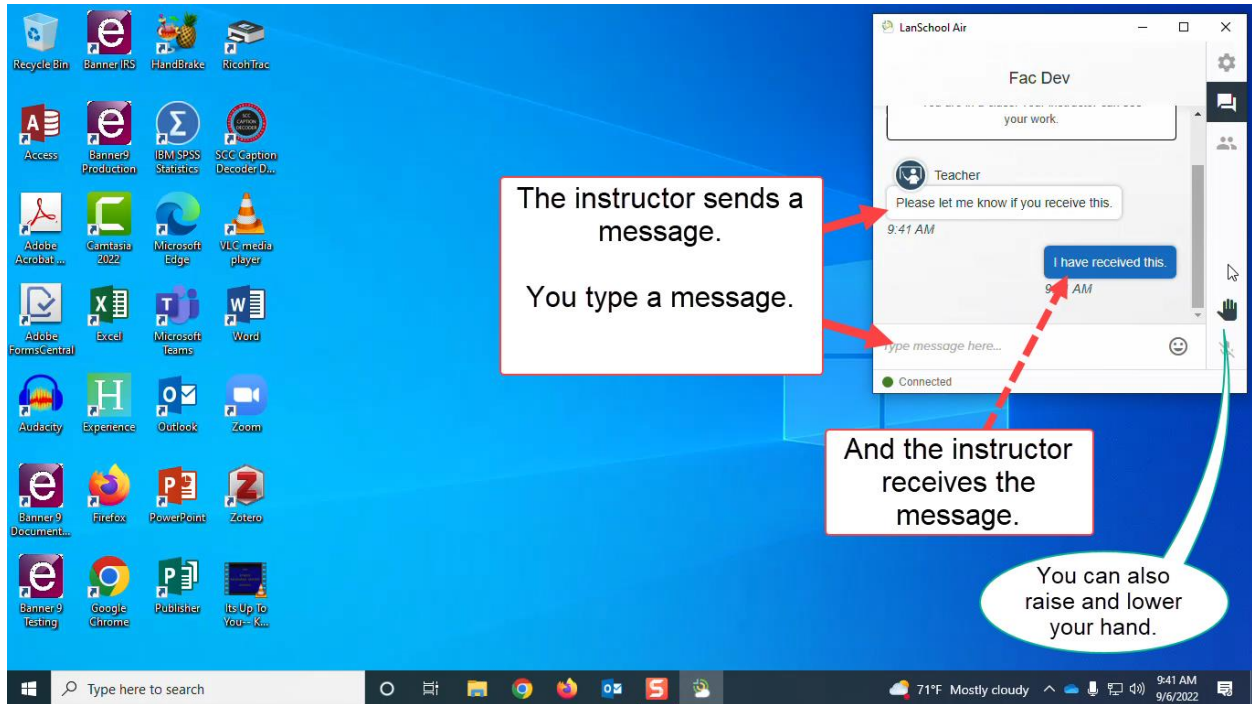
The only change a student will notice is when the instructor blanks all screens in the lab, with a screen display such as the one shown below. "Eyes Up" is a message that can be edited by the instructor.



The instructor may also "push" websites to your lab computer.

If an instructor sends a message to the student, it will display in a window in the corner of the screen such as in the example below. The student may type a reply, and it will be sent to the instructor.



You may also select LanSchool Air from the task bar, use a right mouse click to access messages, and send a message or even raise your hand (which the instructor will see and then perhaps lower).
